Among the key character archetypes identified in the work are the educated yet morally conflicted nobleman, the resilient and dignified peasant, and the indifferent or cruel landowner. Characters such as Kassyan from *Kassyan of Fair Springs* or the peasant boys in *Bezhin Meadow* illustrate this complexity, embodying both the hardships and inner richness of the peasant class.

Turgenev does not engage in direct political agitation; rather, his strength lies in his ability to reveal the silent tragedies and quiet heroism of ordinary people through a restrained, lyrical prose style.
