



THE ROLE OF INTERNET TECHNOLOGIES IN YOUTH EDUCATION IN THE PRESENT TIME

Methods

In carrying out this scientific research, comparative analysis, sociological questionnaires and pedagogical observation methods were effectively used. In

order to comprehensively cover and objectively assess the impact of Internet technologies on the upbringing of young people, scientific-theoretical and practical approaches were combined. Not only were the habits and goals of young people using the Internet studied, but also their personal development, moral views and impact on the educational process were deeply analyzed.

As an empirical part of the research, a sociological survey was conducted among 150 students studying at various higher educational institutions in Tashkent. The survey questions mainly covered the following areas:

- Students' goals in using the Internet (education, entertainment content, social networks, personal development, etc.);
- The impact of the Internet on their moral views and personal values;
- The impact of information received via the Internet on the effectiveness of the educational process;
- Internet addiction, inclination to virtual life and level of social activity.

In addition, local and international scientific sources were analyzed during the research process. Discussion

The results of the conducted research showed that the importance of Internet technologies in the lives of young people is increasing. 85% of students who participated in the survey stated that they associate their daily use of the Internet with the goals of education, information and personal development. They widely use the opportunities to obtain new knowledge via the Internet, participate in online courses and conduct independent research in various disciplines.

At the same time, 62% of students noted that they encounter difficulties in selecting information on the Internet. This indicates the need for young people to analyze information, avoid unfounded information, and form moral immunity.

According to the results of the survey, the Internet also affects the moral views, daily habits and social relationships of young people. In some cases, there are cases of excessive devotion to virtual life, a tendency to inappropriate content on social networks and ineffective spending of time. This confirms the need to further strengthen moral stability and spiritual education.

The analysis shows that maintaining a balance in the use of Internet technologies, fostering a conscious and purposeful approach, can have a positive impact on the spiritual development of young people. In this process, the joint efforts of parents, teachers, educational institutions and public organizations play an important role. Educational measures aimed at forming an information culture among young people, raising awareness about information security, and preserving moral values were identified as one of the urgent tasks.

Conclusion

The above analysis and research results show that Internet technologies play an important role in the upbringing of modern youth.
